3 FACTS VETERINARIANS WISH YOU KNEW ABOUT DJD

Get a better understanding of degenerative joint disease (DJD) and how you and your veterinarian can work together to help manage the disease in your horse.

Degenerative joint disease (DJD) is a major cause of equine lameness.¹ To help keep more horses moving, American Regent Animal Health, maker of Adequan i.m.® (polysulfated glycosaminoglycan), talked to a group of leading equine veterinarians. Here are their top insights about DJD.

Equine DJD, commonly called osteoarthritis, may cause lameness in horses of all ages and breeds. It is characterized by progressive deterioration of the articular cartilage along with changes in bone and soft tissues of the joint.¹

Veterinarians diagnose DJD, in part, by looking at radiographs. Dr. Kyla Ortved, the Jacques Jenny Endowed Term Chair of Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center, said she sees a lot of pre-purchase X-rays from people looking to buy young horses. "I'm finding that a lot of those pretty young horses have radiographic changes," Dr. Ortved says.

A proactive joint-health approach for the average performance horse should include twice-a-year lameness exams and hoof radiographs to guide the farrier, according to Dr. Kent Allen, owner of Virginia Equine Imaging and a founder of the International Society of Equine Locomotor Pathology. Because DJD gets worse over time, it's important to manage it



They're going to be successful at their job, and they're going to keep doing the job," Dr. Allen said. "And that's where I've focused my efforts on use of Adequan i.m. A NEW ERA FOR U.S. DRESSAGE

The US Equestrian Open Dressage Series and Final Take Center Stage

In a landmark step toward elevating equestrian sport in the United States, US Equestrian launched the US Equestrian Open concept in 2024, an ambitious new series designed to showcase the nation's best talent in the Olympic disciplines of dressage, eventing, and jumping on a global stage. With all three discipline finals broadcast live on ESPN, the US Equestrian Open marks a major stride in bringing equestrian sport to broader audiences while providing athletes with unprecedented opportunities for recognition and reward. The US Equestrian Open of Dressage represents the pinnacle of this new initiative. Structured as a season-long series of qualifying competitions, the US Equestrian Open

Dressage Series spans 23 CDI-level events across the country, including many at the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival in Wellington, Fla., each offering riders the chance to earn points toward qualification for the year-end US Equestrian Open Dressage Final. Only the top 18 athletes in the overall standings are invited to compete in the prestigious final where artistry, precision, and partnership take center stage in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle test to determine the winner.

Set against the stunning backdrop of the Desert International Horse Park in Thermal, California, the US Equestrian Open Dressage Final will run November 12-15, 2026, with \$200,000 in prize money distributed

among participating combinations in the Saturday night FEI Grand Prix Freestyle. A separate \$50,000 high point series incentive will recognize consistency and excellence across the season, rewarding athletes who demonstrate brilliance throughout their campaigns.

To be eligible for the Final, competitors must complete a minimum of two Grand Prix Freestyle tests at designated US Equestrian Open qualifying CDIs within the 2026 season. The format ensures that the Final features the best of the best combinations, and horse-and-athlete partnerships have showcased consistency across multiple high-level performances.

For Laura Roberts, Managing Director of Dressage at US Equestrian, the series represents both a competitive milestone and a cultural shift within the sport.

"This is a great opportunity to showcase top dressage sport from coast to coast of the United States, but particularly out west in the buildup to the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games," said Roberts. "The US Equestrian Open Dressage Series and Final are open to all FEI-registered athletes and horses, both from the U.S. and abroad. Each competition gives athletes the platform to showcase their talents and compete with their peers across the country. With unprecedented prize

money on the line, we look forward to witnessing exceptional performances and crowning the inaugural US Equestrian Open Dressage champion."

For Olympic medalist and U.S. Dressage stalwart Steffen Peters, the US Equestrian Open represents more than a new championship, it's a way to deepen the sport's connection with its fans.

"The American crowd gets so into it," Peters told the US Equestrian Open podcast. "They bring the score up. There's no doubt in my mind."

That bond between the horse, rider, and audience is what Peters hoped to see again when he joined the US Equestrian Open Dressage Final commentary team at the inaugural Final.

"I was excited to be there with empathy," he said. "When someone has a mistake, I feel it. When someone has a great ride, I react to that emotionally. I know what it feels like to be in that moment." Peters believes the US Equestrian Open Dressage Series and Final are transformative not only for riders, but for fans discovering the sport for the first time.

"It's such a wonderful idea to have this Series here in the United States," he said. "It's bringing dressage into the mainstream, where people who might not know the sport can suddenly fall in love with it. We saw that with Mopsie -- millions of people saw him online and thought, this is dressage? That's what the Open can do, too."

He also highlighted the significance of holding the inaugural Final in California, a reflection of growing the audience base of dressage looking ahead to 2028. With world-class footing, an energetic atmosphere, and a venue built to bring fans closer to the action,

Thermal embodies what the series stands for: connection, excitement, and exceptional sport. For Peters, it's also about community.

"It gives riders and horses the chance to shine under pressure and fans the chance to be part of something special. That's what keeps the sport growing."



The Lövsta Future Challenge Jumping tour provides seven-year-old horses the chance to gain invaluable experience in a competitive environment. This upcoming season, the tour will host

With over 200 entries from more than a dozen nationalities, we saw how crucial it is to put future stars into the spotlight. Para Dressage

Para Dressage is the sport of Dressage, the highest expression of horse training, for Athletes with an impairment. Conducted under the same basic rules, but with athletes classified according to the level of their impairment, the horse has to perform at a walk, trot, and canter, and all tests are ridden from memory and follow a prescribed pattern of movements. The only exception is the Freestyle which is specifically choreographed for each horse and is performed to music. Para Dressage is the only Equestrian discipline included in the Paralympic Games, where it has been a regular fixture since 1996. The Paralympic Games are the second largest sporting event in the world after the Olympic Games, and are contested immediately after the Olympic Games in the same city and at the same venue.

Concours Dressage International: CDI

An acronym for Concours Dressage International, a dressage competition recognized by the FEI. As CDI-W, there are World Cup qualifying or World Cup classes at the show, as CDIO there are Olympic qualifying or Olympic classes at the show.

Dressage

Dressage is a competitive equestrian sport, defined by the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) as “the highest expression of horse training.” The rider will be relaxed and appear effort-free while the horse willingly performs the requested movement. In modern dressage competition, successful training at the various levels is demonstrated through the performance of “tests,” prescribed series of movements ridden within a standard arena. Dressage is considered the most artistic of the equestrian sports and can be traced back centuries. The Freestyle is choreographed and performed to music.



Dressage Riders To Watch

Adrienne Lyle – USA

- Adrienne Lyle is a three-time Olympian who proudly calls Wellington, Florida, home. She helped secure Team Gold for the United States in 2012, and earned Team Silver at the 2021 Olympic Games. Currently ranked No. 17 in the world on the FEI Dressage Rankings, Lyle continues to be a leading force in international dressage.
- Raised on her parents' cattle ranch, Lyle developed a lifelong passion for horses early on. She began her equestrian journey in the United States Pony Club and discovered dressage through three-day eventing. Her first major accolade came in 2004 at the North American Youth Championships. Soon after, she became a working student for Olympian Debbie McDonald, who remains her trainer and business partner to this day.
- Lyle received the USEF Young Adult Brentina Cup in 2008 and has since represented the U.S. in multiple FEI World Cup™ Finals, FEI World Equestrian Games, and other top-level competitions aboard celebrated mounts such as Wizard, Salvino, and Helix. In 2024, Lyle achieved a top-10 individual finish with Helix in the Grand Prix at the FEI World Cup™ Final in Basel, Switzerland. During the 2025 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival, she claimed five victories, including both the CDI5* Grand Prix and Grand Prix Freestyle.
- Lyle is a strong contender for the 2026 World Championships, and one to watch during AGDF 2026.

Currently ranked No. 35 in the FEI Dressage World Rankings, Kevin Kohmann has established himself as a prominent competitor on the international stage. A German native from a family of dressage breeders, Kevin's talent was evident early on when he claimed the North German Pony Champion title at just 14 years old. He went on to become Germany's youngest professional rider and later the youngest recipient of the prestigious Pferdewirtschaftsmeister certification, often referred to as the "master's degree" of horse management. After a successful career representing Team Germany, Kevin proudly became a U.S. citizen and now rides for Team USA.

Based out of Diamante Farms in Wellington, Florida, Kevin continues to make his mark on the sport while operating his own business dedicated to training and developing elite horses and riders.

In 2025, Kevin celebrated a milestone season at the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival, delivering a career-best performance in the CDI-W Grand Prix Freestyle with an impressive score of 79.24% aboard Dünensee. He also achieved a personal high score of 71.52% in the Grand Prix, earning a coveted spot at the 2025 FEI World Cup™ Final in Basel, Switzerland, where he finished among the top 15 riders in the world with Dünensee.

Kevin Kohmann – USA

Jemma Heran – AUS

- Once a practicing corporate lawyer, Jemma Heran has transitioned into a full-time dressage career and is quickly establishing herself as a rider to watch at the upcoming Adequan® Global Dressage Festival. Heran secured her first CDI victory since 2022 at last year's AGDF and went on to earn a career-best score of 69.021% in the CDI3* Grand Prix Freestyle aboard Total Recall. In 2024, she achieved additional personal bests in the CDI3* Grand Prix and Grand Prix Special with Saphira Royal 2, posting scores of 70.717% and 70.575%.

Evelyn Eger – GER

- Evelyn Eger has quickly established herself as a rising force on the international dressage stage. She made her Adequan® Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) debut in 2025 and left her mark. That season, Eger helped lead her team to Nation's Cup Gold, while also capturing Individual Gold aboard Tabledance 3 with an impressive score of 77.235%.
- Eger has a particular flair for the Young Horse divisions, where her partnership with Jumanji 23 shone brightly. Together, they swept the CDIYH classes at AGDF 2025 with four victories. The year prior, she and

Global Power OLD earned a remarkable second place in the FEI World Championships for Young Horses (7-year-old division) in Ermelo, posting a score of 81.099%.

- Her current string is headlined by Tabledance 3, a horse she has developed since he was just seven. Starting out in the U25 division, Eger has steadily climbed the international ranks, now competing at the CDI5* and World Cup level. She currently sits 42nd in the FEI Dressage World Rankings (CDI3 and above)* and holds the No. 7 spot worldwide in the FEI Dressage World Ranking for CDI1/CDIO1*.

- Fiona Howard has quickly become a standout for U.S. Para Dressage since transitioning from reining to the international dressage stage. A Grade II competitor, she made her Paralympic debut at the Paris 2024 Games with Diamond Dunes, together they captured three gold medals, Individual Grade II, Individual Freestyle Grade II, and the Team event, making her a one-time Paralympian and three-time Paralympic champion.
- Born and raised in England to an American mother and British father, Howard began riding at age three and grew up immersed in Pony Club, learning jumping, eventing, polocrosse, and polo. Howard's first passion was reining, where she went to qualify for the FEI European Reining Championships for Juniors and Young Riders, she earned bronze in 2013 as the youngest competitor at just 14, and competed again in 2016.
- In 2021, Howard switched to para dressage and brought rapid success. Partnered with Diamond Dunes, she represented the United States at the

2025 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival CPEDI3*, helping the team to victory and setting a world record and personal best in the FEI Grade II Grand Prix Freestyle with a score of 83.267%. That same month, she reached World #1 in the FEI Para Dressage rankings, confirming her status as a leading force in the sport.

- Howard's triple-gold Paralympic triumph and world-record performance reinforce that she will be one to watch at this year's Adequan® Global Dressage Festival.

Floratina – Rebecca Hart

Floratina (Fidertanz x Rubinstein 46), affectionately known as "Flora", has left an extraordinary legacy in both FEI dressage and para dressage sport. With Canadian rider Lindsay Kellock, Flora captured a Pan American Games Gold Medal, showcasing her talent at the highest level of FEI competition. In 2023, she partnered with US para dressage rider Rebecca Hart, and together they made history at the 2024 Paris Paralympic Games, earning three Gold Medals (Grade III Individual Test, Freestyle, and Team),

securing the United States' first-ever Paralympic team gold. This remarkable achievement makes Floratina one of the few horses to win gold medals in both CDI and CPEDI competition. Now 17 years old, the Hanoverian mare continues to shine on the international stage with strong performances at CPEDI3* events in Ocala, Fontainebleau, Mannheim, and Hagen. Dünensee (Dancier x Davignon I) and U.S. rider Kevin Kohmann have proven that sometimes the most unlikely partnerships lead to the greatest success. Originally purchased as a young horse for US Dressage rider, Devon Kane, Dünensee, affectionately known as "Denzel" in the barn, quickly outgrew his rider and seemed destined for the sales list.

Kohmann took over the ride in 2022, and the two have since developed into a formidable international pair. Now 16, the Hanoverian gelding has already represented

the U.S. at back-to-back FEI World Cup™ Finals, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia in 2024, and Basel, Switzerland in 2025.

Highlights include a 79.24% in the Grand Prix Freestyle and a 71.52% in the Grand Prix at the 2025 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival. Averaging in the mid-70s for the Freestyle and high 60s in the Grand Prix and Grand Prix Special, Dünensee continues to thrive under Kohmann's guidance. With his ever-growing presence in the arena, Dünensee is a crowd favorite and one to watch at this year's Adequan® Global Dressage Festival.



Tabledance 3 – Evelyn Eger

Tabledance 3 (Totilas x Glendale) and Evelyn Eger have become a standout partnership in the dressage world. Produced by Hof Kasselmann's homebred Totilas, this 12-year-old Oldenburg mare has been with Eger for six years, progressing from the U25 division to the international stage. Eger achieved career-high scores for Tabledance 3, including 77.235% in the GP-Freestyle, 70.435% in the GP, both at the 2025 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival, and 71.17% in the GP-S at Hagen a.T.W in

Germany. Tabledance 3 has competed in six World Cups, six Team Events, and six CDI5 competitions*, consistently demonstrating her talent and consistency.

With her proven record, she and Eger are top contenders for the 2026 Global Dressage Festival presented by Adequan® and a pair to watch this season.

Mount St John Freestyle - Cathrine Laudrup-Dufour

Mount St John Freestyle (Fidermark x Donnerhall 11) and Catherine Laudrup-Dufour have quickly become one of the most talked-about pairs in international dressage. The 16-year-old Hanoverian mare was formerly campaigned by Charlotte Dujardin, and now is co-owned by Emma Blundell of Mount St John Equestrian and join company Laudrup-Dufour & Zinglersen Aps.

In 2024, the pair made their Olympic debut together in Paris, Laudrup-Dufour's third Olympic appearance, where they captured Gold in the Individual Grand

Prix Special and Silver in the team event. The next year, they achieved two new personal bests: 83.33% in the Grand Prix and an astonishing 91.14% in the Grand Prix Freestyle, setting new career highs for both horse and rider.

Now averaging 87.6% in the Grand Prix Freestyle, the elegant mare continues to demonstrate world-class expression and harmony in the arena. With her proven record and undeniable presence, she remains one of the sport's brightest stars to watch in the seasons ahead.

The name 3 Graces Dressage was an inspired by Peter Paul Rubens painting, The Three Graces. Ruben's masterpiece painted in the 1600's, hangs

in the Museo del Prado in Madrid. Carol and Blake saw the painting when visiting the museum and knew it was the right name for their farm in Wellington, Florida. Today, 3 Graces represents the philosophy of the farm, with the three graces being- Growth, Gratitude and Generosity. Growth represents Rebecca's growth in the sport, Gratitude is the feeling that the entire family feels toward the farm and their lives, and Generosity represents their commitment to giving back to horse sport, the community, and other important endeavors.

In the spirit behind 3 Graces, Carol got the inspiration to bring



something new and valuable to the Wellington Dressage community for the 2026 season. During trips to Europe with Rebecca, Carol became increasingly enthralled with the deeply rooted European training methods and at the 2025 Swedish Knytkalaset, she got the idea to share the access to this level of training to more US riders. Carol went to the powers that be at Wellington International and suggested an interactive master class with three legendary

trainers she had personal access to; Kyra Kryklund, Jan Brink, and Cathrine Dufour. "It will be like nothing that has ever been done before with these 3 powerhouses teaching the principles of correct, compassionate connection", she explained. The team at Wellington International realized how a master class of this magnitude could truly contribute to the sport and worked closely with Carol to produce the

2026 Dressage Infusion Master Class. With Carol's connections and enthusiasm and Wellington International's ability to conduct dressage events at this level, the 2026 Dressage Infusion Master Class became a reality.

The name Dressage Infusion expressed exactly what Carol hopes the Master Class will do-infuse the sport with positive training foundations. "I hope each person who attends, will take away a few "ah ha" moments that they can use to bring their own riding and training to new levels," Carol shared. "We are at an interesting precipice in our sport. It is time to reconnect with the best training principles and bring more compassion to training and competing. I am so grateful to Wellington International for sharing this sentiment and stepping up to help make this event a turning point for our sport".

Along with her commitment to the Dressage Infusion Master Class to be hosted January 21st at the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival, Carol has also raised 3 Graces' commitment to supporting the sport on several fronts. In addition to 3 Graces Dressage continuing their sponsorship support of Global Dressage and the Wellington Classic Dressage circuit for 2026, the farm has also become a United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) partner for 2026, supporting the USEF Dressage Grand Prix National Championships and the US Dressage Festival of Champions.

Meanwhile, Rebecca Cohen who has been a dressage rider since she was a toddler, is returning from Europe for the 2026 season with eight FEI horses that she has been developing with guidance from Jan Brink and Kyra Kryklund in Europe and coaching from Allison

Brock in Florida. Last season, Rebecca came into her own with 2 major wins on two of her horses. Rebecca rode her 11-year-old, Jameson to win the Lövsta Future Challenge for the Developing Grand Prix and qualified for the final, and on Prince of Hope, Rebecca won the Buffalo Wild Wings Future Challenge. Rebecca has high hopes for her horses for the 2026 season with plans to continue develop and compete them.

Rebecca's lifelong pursuit has been a no corner's cut approach. She has a string of young horses, that she has been hands-on with their training and development. Getting a made horse is a choice for some riders", explains Rebecca, "But my personal goal is to learn the art of making a top-level horse and learning and practicing the best training methods, so I can train and develop horses throughout my career". Her approach has earned her the respect of her trainers, her family, and the team at 3 Graces Dressage.

Along with sponsoring the CDI5* Grand Prix division in 2026, 3 Graces Dressage will also be awarding the 3 Graces Award to recognize one rider at each of 2026 Adequan® Global Dressage CDI competition. 


Rebecca Hart:

Turning Determination into a Lifelong Partnership with Horses

For Paralympic dressage rider Rebecca Hart, horses have never just been a sport, they've been a lifeline. What began as an outlet for a young girl learning to navigate life with a

disability evolved into an extraordinary career that has taken her to the world's most prestigious arenas, including multiple Paralympic Games and FEI World Championships.

"I found horses when I was ten years old," Hart shared.

"I was coming to terms with being a disabled kid and I was angry about being 'different.' I couldn't run or do sports like all my friends, and I just wanted to fit in. When I found horses, I realized it didn't matter that my legs didn't work, if I could learn a way to communicate with them, I could ride just as well as everyone else. Horses were an equalizer. They allowed me to turn the anger I felt at my disability into a passion."

That passion soon became her purpose. Her natural connection with horses and her relentless drive led her to the world of para dressage, though it wasn't her original path. "My mom found an article about the Paralympics in Practical Horseman and

thought it could be an interesting route," Hart recalled. "I was hesitant at first because I started out jumping, but at a show in Georgia in 1998, I sat on my first real dressage horse and realized the level of communication you can have. I was hooked."

The turning point for Hart - and for para-equestrian sport as a whole - came when the discipline transitioned to "own horse" competition in 2004. "Before that, it was more like collegiate competition where you catch rode," she explained. "When it switched, it allowed riders to develop

real partnerships with their horses, and the level of riding became so much higher." Just four years later, Hart earned her first team berth, representing the United States at the 2008 Paralympic Games.

That deep partnership is something she's continued to prioritize throughout her career. "When looking for a new partner, I look for a thinking and confident horse," she said. "They need to want to work with you and handle the big atmospheres. They have to want to show off a little bit and enjoy their job. In para sport, the walk is critical, it has to be big, very clear,

and cat-like. The walk and the brain are my two big non-negotiables. The rest you can develop through training."


Her process for improvement is equally methodical and introspective. After each test, she reviews feedback from all angles - coach, judges, and her own intuition. "I immediately discuss the test with my coach on the way back to stabling," she explained. "Then I do a lot of personal analysis based on my feel and the judges' remarks. Using video, I compare the look and the feel to see if there's any discrepancy.

Then I can take all that information back into training to build toward the next competition."

While balancing an international career, Hart also maintains an unconventional but steadfast professional partnership - with Starbucks. "I started working there when I was a young, struggling working student," she said with a laugh. "I needed extra income and health insurance, so I picked up shifts. But it turned into something much more. My manager told me about the Elite Athlete Program, which supports

employees competing at high-performance levels. I put together a proposal, and now, 16 years later, Starbucks is one of my sponsors. They provide financial backing and the flexibility to travel and compete internationally."

After an incredible showing in Paris, Hart is already looking ahead. "My goals for this upcoming season are to start gearing my horses up for the World Championships in Aachen," she said. "We'll begin qualifying at Global

in January and may head to some CPEDIs in Europe. I also want to help continue building direct support for para sport and developing pathways for aspiring young riders."

Through every milestone, from her first dressage test to the Paralympic podium, Rebecca Hart has shown what's possible when resilience meets purpose. "Horses were my equalizer," she said. "Now, they're my teammates in chasing dreams I never thought were possible."







Frederic Wandres has firmly established himself on the international dressage stage. His Olympic debut at the 2024 Paris Games was nothing short of remarkable, earning Team Gold in the Grand Prix Special and securing a top-10 individual finish with Bluetooth OLD in the Grand Prix.

Wandres came over to North America in 2023, making a standout debut at the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival with six consecutive CDI victories, a streak he continued into 2024 with another

six wins. Trained at the renowned Kasselmann Farm in Hagen, Germany, Wandres now splits his time between Europe and North America, spending winters at Kasselmann's new base near Wellington, Florida.

Raised in a non-equestrian family, Wandres developed an early passion for horses, starting with lunge-line lessons before dedicating every spare moment to the barn. His dedication propelled him to the sport's highest levels, amassing accolades that include his Olympic Gold Medal, a bronze medal

at the 2022 FEI World Championships in Herning, Germany, Wandres now splits his time between Europe and North America, spending winters at Kasselmann's new base near Wellington, Florida.

Following his Olympic triumph, Wandres returns to the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival poised to deliver another unforgettable season.

Tinne Vilhelmsen Silfén - SWE

Born into an equestrian family, her passion for dressage was inspired early on by her mother, who also rode competitively. She began riding at the age of seven, and her dedication quickly propelled her onto the international stage. From 1985 to 1988, she represented Germany on the National Young Rider Team, achieving remarkable success as the Nordic Champion with her horse, Modsun. Over the course of her career, she has competed in seven Olympic Games, earning top-four team finishes in both 1992 and 2008, and achieving an impressive eighth place with Don Arullio in the 2016 Olympic games. Her experience

includes participation in 125 World Cups, 60 team competitions, and 47 championship events, reflecting her enduring commitment to excellence in the sport. Most recently, she secured a notable placing with her horse Hyatt in the 2025 Continental/Regional Championships in Crozet, competing in the Grand Prix Special. Beyond her success in the arena, she has also made a lasting mark on the sport through her work at Lövsta Stuteri, a breeding and training operation she co-founded with her family in 2007. Today, as Head of Stud at Lövsta, she continues to shape the future of dressage.

Kate Shoemaker has been a driving force for U.S. Para Dressage since her international debut in 2018. A Grade IV competitor, she has represented Team USA at multiple Paralympic Games and FEI World Championships, earning medals on every stage.


Shoemaker made her Paralympic debut at Tokyo 2021, where she and Solitaer 40 helped secure Team Bronze, the first Paralympic team medal for the U.S. program. The pair also earned top-four and top-seven individual finishes. At the Paris 2024 Games,

Shoemaker returned with Vianne, capturing Individual Bronze in the Grade IV Freestyle and finishing top five in the Grand Prix Test A.


Her World Championship record includes Individual Bronze with Solitaer 40 at the 2018 FEI World Equestrian Games and Individual Silver and Team Bronze with Quiana at the 2022 FEI Para Dressage World Championships in Herning, Denmark.

Competing in Grade IV due to motor control challenges caused by periventricular ischemia, Shoemaker adapts with

specialized equipment to ride at the highest level. Her resilience and consistency have made her a cornerstone of Team USA and a multi-medalist on the international stage. Currently ranked top-4 in the FEI Para Dressage World Individual Ranking. Keep an eye out for Shoemaker at the 2026 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival.




In the chaos of the 2008 recession, she moved to one of the last unrehabbed lofts in downtown St Louis; it was full of artists who


